<u>Deciduous</u>

Deciduous means to fall off. In relation to plants, this means that the plant loses its leaves, usually in autumn. In autumn, deciduous trees shed their leaves as they are no longer needed and the amount of sunlight has reduced. The leaves will then grow again in spring.








